In 2022 Helen was recognised by members of the profession as a Criminal Law Rising Star in the 2022 Doyle's Guide – Sydney.

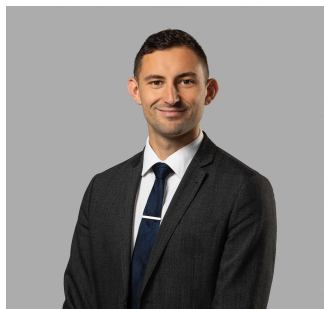

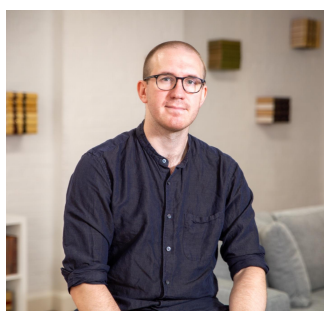
