David is a Senior Lecturer at the University of Sydney Law School with a particular focus on the law of contract, restitution and commercial remedies. He holds a BSc and LLB from UNSW and a BCL (Dist), MPhil and DPhil from the University of Oxford. His doctoral dissertation, which formed the basis for his book, *Money Awards in Contract Law*, examined the award of damages for breach of contract, proposing a novel understanding of the area which challenges the law's conventional interpretation. Prior to his arrival, David was a Lecturer at UNSW, a stipendiary lecturer at St Anne's College, Oxford and was in practice in both Sydney (commercial litigation) and New York (Bankruptcy & Restructuring). He is also admitted as a legal practitioner in NSW (2006) and as an Attorney in New York (2012).
