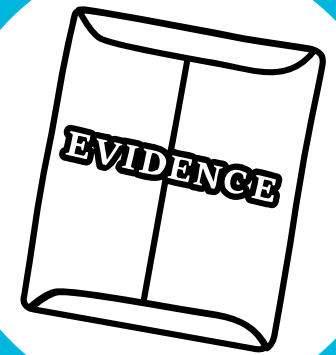


2 TYPES OF CIRCUMSTANTIAL CASES

1. Strands in a Cable

Strands in a Cable is an apt analogy for the situation where a singular piece of evidence doesn't hold up the whole case.

In these types of cases, breaking a single strand doesn't mean the case falls over.



2. Link in a Chain

Link in a Chain describes the situation where - despite a case otherwise being a strong one - a single piece of evidence could "break the chain".

Unlike a *Strands in a Cable* situation, this means the whole case falls apart.
