TIPS FOR PREPARING EXPERT EVIDENCE

Expert evidence is admissible under section 79 of the *Evidence Act 1995* (Cth) as an exception to the opinion rule. Below are some tips for how to engage and prepare an expert.



Identify the right expert

Before you engage an expert, identify exactly what kind of expert is needed.

For example, you might need an auctioneer, real estate agent or business valuer.



State your assumptions

In briefing your expert, state your assumptions.

A successful engagement involves asking the right questions, providing source materials, and preparing a list of assumptions or facts.



Prepare for cross examination

Assist the expert to prepare by doing a dry run of cross examination.

Ask the expert questions which may arise in relation to their report. Be careful not to coach answers.



Engage a shadow expert

Where financially possible, engaging a shadow or "dirty" expert is a practical way of testing an existing independent expert report or preparing the legal team to brief an independent expert.
