

### **CURRENT EXEMPTIONS**

Alec anticipates that both the employee records exemption and the small business exemption will be retired - although with a slightly different pathway for each. Many businesses already limit their reliance on these exemptions.






### "RIGHT TO BE FORGOTTEN"

One proposed reform brings Australian law closer to the operation of the GDPR - that is the "right to be forgotten". This means greater obligations related to data deidentification, and ensuring data is never reidentified.

## **DIRECT INDIVIDUAL ACTION**

The Report proposes allowing individuals to bring direct action against entities following a complaint to the OAIC; including implementing a process similar to state tribunals like NCAT and enhancing the tools available to the court.





# **NEW REGIMES FOR CHILDREN**

The Report proposes a new, seperate code of conduct that would apply to all online services dealing with children - similar to the Codes applicable in comparable jurisdictions like the US and UK.
