Ensure you conduct frequent workplace inspections to assess risks in the workplace. Attempt to visit the workplace, in person, as frequently as possible. Thoroughly read risk assessment reports.

Have a safety management plan that is easily accessible for employees. Also, make sure it is simple and quick to follow.
